

Subject Selection for Further Education and Training (FET)

There are four (4) main different Matric Pass levels:

- [Bachelor's Degree Pass](#)
- Diploma Pass
- Higher Certificate Pass
- Senior Certificate Pass

Bachelor's Degree Pass Level

A [Bachelor's Degree Pass](#) is the highest Matric pass level you can get. This pass level will allow you to further your studies at university, given that you meet all the other university entry requirements. In order to obtain this pass, you must have the following minimum marks:

- 40% for your Home Language
- 50% for four (4) other High Credit Subjects
- 30% for two (2) other subjects

Diploma Pass Level

A Diploma Pass is the second highest Matric pass level. With this pass, you will be able to study a Diploma course at a tertiary institution like a college or university of technology. In order to obtain this pass, you must have the following minimum marks:

- 40% for your Home Language
- 40% for four (4) other High Credit Subjects
- 30% for two (2) other subjects

Higher Certificate Pass Level

A Higher Certificate Pass is the third Matric pass level. With this pass level, you will be able to study a Higher Certificate course at a college of your choosing. In order to obtain this pass, you must have the following minimum marks:

- 40% for your Home Language
- 40% for two (2) other subjects
- 30% for three (3) other subjects

Senior Certificate Pass Level

This pass level is the minimum requirement for passing your Matric. With this pass, you will be able to study any course that requires you to have a Matric Certificate. In order to obtain this pass, you must have the following minimum marks:

- 40% in your Home Language
- 40% in two (2) other subjects
- 30% in three (3) other subjects

The National Curriculum Statement requires that pupil's study four core subjects: two languages, Mathematics or Mathematical Literacy, and Life Orientation. Pupils then choose another three subjects, making a total of seven in all.

Applying this requirement to our subject offering at Acts House of Education, it is compulsory for pupils to study English **AND** one First Additional Language (FAL) **AND** Mathematics or Mathematical Literacy **AND** Life Orientation.
